of my-Beautiful Mr. Commissioner, I am Rattan Singh Kalsi from London, Ontario and I lost my beloved daughter in the bombing of AI Flight 182. The worst thing in life is to lose a child. That is what happened to us. We lost children. Parents should die $\sqrt{}$ NIN-01-D-Age- this is Really highered her before their children. Children should not die before their parents.

Could you tell us a little about yourself?

I am originally from India, but moved to England at the age of 19 to pursue my post-secondary education. I lived there for many years, first to attend the Paddington Technical school in London for three years and then to complete a practical apprenticeship with the company, SE Opperman for another three years. I am trained as a general machinist and work in mechanical engineering in the specialized of tool and dye making. I chose this profession because my older brother was in the same trade and I knew it was a profession in great demand.

When did you get married?

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I got married in 1957. I went to India to get married and I came back to England with my wife. We have six children, although we lost one in the bombing. All our children were born in England.

What was life like in England for you and your family?

I worked in England for 15 years from 1952-1967. Life was great in England. In 1967, I was working with Cosworth Engineering on their Formula 1 racing engine COSTE/S/ team. My two bosses, Coslemand Duckworth, are good friends of mine, even today, I could back and they would give me my job back. They tried to keep me in England – they warned me about the Canadian winter and told me I would be back. I left my family in England and arrived in Canada alone in February. I remember there was three feet of snow on the ground and my bosses' warning rang in my head. After about a month here, I fell ill. I missed my family and nearly decided to move back to England. However, my Canadian boss told me that if I went back now, I did not even try. Soon the summer came around and I began to warm up to Canada.

Why did you decide to come to Canada?

I decided to immigrate to Canada because I believed that there would be better opportunities for my children here. I felt that there was more opportunity, more space and possibility here in Canada. All my children were under 10 years of age at that time, Indira herself was just four when I immigrated to Canada. Had I known that I would have lost my beloved daughter, Indira, because of this choice, I would never have come.

I love England, still to this day. When I left England, it was purely for my family. I was happy there and had already achieved everything that I hoped for in life. I had a large family with three boys and three daughters. I had an interesting and well-paid job with friends as bosses. I was well-settled in England: a car, a house, a wife, children and a permanent job. England treated me very nicely.

I understand that you moved to Canada to start a new job.

One day, however, I saw an ad for a job in Canada, applied and was selected. The Canadian government assisted me with relocation expenses and located job for me in Milton, Ontario. I paid back all the assistance that I received from the Canadian government, which was approximately \$1000, a lot of money at that time. I did not want to keep Canadian government's money. At times, this makes me remark that I do not owe anything to the Canadian government, but they owe me my daughter.

Can you described to us a little about your new life in Canada?

Commissioner Major, please know that I love Canada, by the way, I am a Canadian. I became a Canadian citizen immediately when I arrived her, since as a British citizen I did not have to wait the typical mandatory 5-year waiting period. I still have my British citizenship but do not have Indian citizenship. The day I landed, 1967 election was on, the election that brought Trudeau to power. I have much civic pride; I read the newspapers to stay aware of social issues and did lots of political campaign work for both Trudeau and Mulroney – I was not associated with just one political party, but rather supported the politicians who I believed had the best ideas for the good of the people. I remained very politically active until 1985; that is, until I lost Indira in the bombing. Today, certainly, I still vote, but I no longer actively support any political campaign.

I understand that you ran a non-profit company in Canada.

I knew that I had been asked to come to Canada to use my specialized skills as a Dik-G-MAEHIGIST tool and dye-maker for the benefit of this country. So, I decided to what better way to do that than to give my skills to other Canadians. I opened a non-profit company to train others on my craft, to allow them to achieve better wages as my work was well-paid. In the short life of the company, I trained four people, all who have good jobs today paying well over \$80,000 annually. One is a professor teaching others the tool and dye trade. Another is working for a large corporation. I was incapable of continuing with the company after Indira's death. If I had, I would have surely trained over 50 people by now and given them skills that would have improved their standard of life.

The Oakville MP used to come to tell me that I was doing a wonderful job for Canada. I said, "It's nothing, I am a Canadian, I have to do it." I fulfilled my obligation to Canada happily, and then the Canadian government failed in its obligation to protect AI Flight 182 and my daughter. 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Indira trusted us completely (marriage): One day, her high school teacher, Ms. Ghoshe, told me about a conversation she had with Indira. She had asked Indira, "Indira, you are a western and Canadian girl. How will you marry?" She was asking Indira about arranged marriages. She said that Indira replied, "I trust my dad and my mom. They never do anything wrong with me. I will marry whomever they suggest." She was like that, she loved us so much. Today, my other five children are married by their choice; they found their own



partners and are living happily ever after. We never forced anyone on any of our children. She was always going out of her way to be kind to others. I warned her not to come home too late from all these activities, but she would say, "Don't worry about me."

Indira wanted to care for me in my old age: I remember telling Indira that one day she would get married and move away. She replied that she wanted to buy a house down the street so that she could care for my wife and I. I told her that I could care for myself, there was no need, but she always insisted on this.

Buying a car: I remember Indira brought home a Buick. I found out that she had bought it and asked her why. I did not expect such a big car, I thought she would prefer a little Toyota. She told me that she had bought it for the family. In fact, she showed me the ownership papers and she had put my name on it! She thought about family first, before herself.

She had such a soft personality, she would respect everybody.



What was the purpose of your daughter's trip to India?

I wanted to show my children my roots in India. Today, I feel that I should not have made that decision. They were Canadian, it was wrong to send them to India. I had no idea about the Indian political situation. I knew that there was some unrest, but underestimated the danger there. We discussed how to stay safe - I told my children that when we go to India, we would avoid danger

I went to India two weeks ahead of my family. I did this to check the accommodations. In Canada, we had the luxuries of an air-conditioned house, meals cooked on the table. I had heard that the water was not good in Delhi; I feared that my children would get sick. I went ahead because I was protecting my children. I have always been protective of my children. Despite these efforts, I could not protect Indira.

Was Indira excited about the trip? What did she want to do?

Indira was excited to go. She had made up her mind to see her granny in India, who was well over 80. She also wanted to see where I had come from, our family history. My father had been a social worker in India. He had helped to build a school in India, which is now a university. The people from the school always asked me to send my dad's picture and I never gave them any picture. Indira was finally bringing the picture of my father — it was a truly saintly picture,

my father had a glowing presence in it - to give it to the school. Indira had never been to India before; the bombers stopped her from ever seeing it. She wanted to go to the Golden Temple. She did not know that the conflict around the Golden Temple would lead to her death before she even set eyes on it.

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I mentioned to a Canadian official in Cork that I used to hear in the media that there are Sikh separatists in Canada and that they were probably (but not definitely) the ones that brought down the plane. He replied, "Keep it down, don't tell anybody about this." He was quite rude. He should have told me that Canada would do their best to catch the culprit, but instead he told me to shut up. I could recognize that official to this day.

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Did you receive any offers of support after the bombing?

There was never support from the Canadian government. From the Irish however, yes, there was definitely support. If I was hungry, they would come and feed me, even force feed me. I was not really able to eat in those days.

They gave moral support. A priest would come to me, Irish priests who said comforting words, "Whatever has happened it is with the gods. Be a strong person, accept it." The Irish Garda one day took me in their cruiser, drove me 60 miles out of Cork to Blarney just to take my mind off of things. They told me to put my arm around the pillar. 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How did your life change after the bombing?

I lost my non-profit company after losing Indira. I was dealing with the shock of losing my little Canadian girl. No one helped me. At that time, the company was worth around \$175,000; but it went for \$9,000 in bits and pieces. I had a nervous breakdown and I could not take care of my interests. I recovered in 3-4 years. That is the time that the Canadian government could have come to me and helped me start my company again. But they never did offer anything.

Had I been able to continue my business, I would have trained 200-300

Canadians by today who would be making good wages and would have gained valuable skills.

That company was an asset to Canada. We made a little money for food and shelter, but basically, we were a non-profit company working to benefit Canada. The government should have supported this business.

How did you deal with the grief of losing your daughter?

I suffered from the shock of losing Indira for many years. My doctor told me to go to where the plane fell. I had read in the newspapers that they were building memorial in Ireland. He said that if you visit the memorial you may get better.

Did you go to the Irish memorial?

Ireland has given me strength. I started to live again by visiting Ireland. I my that the only one who has gone to the Cork memorial on the anniversary times; I missed less year only because I ran out of funds to travel. I will start saving and hope to go next year.

I understand that you and your wife planted the garden around the memorial?

About 60% of the garden around the memorial, including the east side flower bed, is done by my wife and me. Two or three other families have joined us.

We have all worked to make it beautiful. Irish city councillors also help, but it is mostly my wife and I that are responsible for the garden.

Do you do anything in memory of your daughter?

Every year, I fast on the 23rd of June in memory of Indira.

I also became vegetarian after the crash, because Indira was vegetarian. She chose to be vegetarian because she was against cruelty to animals, not because of any religious reason. She was aware of these social issues.



What do you hope for in this Inquiry? westernes injust

Injustice has been done to us, and saying nothing is supporting injustice. For 21 12DOING years, we have not gotten anything. Everyone in the government knows who is SIKH- SEPARIST responsible for the bombing.

All we ask is that someone to tell us who did it and to take steps to prevent this from happening again. That's all we want.

Is there anything in particular that you would like to comment on?

Canada is far too lenient on terrorists; our system actually encourages them.
