7 am 27 August 1975: Dear Andrew, Your letter did much to cheer me up in the new job I am doing here at home. As you see, I am again in broadcasting, this time, however, at the top, as General Manager. All the chaps here have been trained in Britain, at the BBC, and this has given them a neo-colonialistic approach to broadcasting and to themselves. I am now trying to curb that, and make them talk on radio, as if is the radio station in Barbados and not in a black ghetto in the north of the USA; or as if they're in The BBC Studios. They all wish to be personalities. That is being phased out, one-time. You see the problems I am faced with? However, I am making some progress. My brother, it took me some time before I could settle down into the routine of life in Toronto, after the exciting week down in Halifax. I therefore understand how much you missed the atmosphere and those who provided this atmosphere. I just received your letter about The Arts Festival idea. Let me think about this, this weekend and get back to you next week with a proposal. You now have my address at the CBC. As soon as I have settled in, I shall be better in my correspondence.
